The McClellan-Kerr Arkansas River Navigation System (MKARNS) in eastern Oklahoma is a 445-mile marine highway for commerce by barge to and from the Gulf of Mexico, in addition to providing navigation, hydropower, recreation, water supply and fish and wildlife habitats for our state.
